Title: Jesus is the Better Intercessor

Scripture: Hebrews 7:23-28

- We must acknowledge we need an intercessor between God and ourselves.
 - a. God is Holy. (1 Samuel 2:2)
 - b. We are sinful. (Psalm 51:5)
 - c. Our sin separates us from God. (Isaiah 59:2, Romans 5:12)
 - d. The payment for sin is death. (Eph. 2:3, Rom. 6:23)
 - e. We cannot approach God without an intercessor. (Exod. 33:20, 1 Tim. 2:5, Romans 5:1)
- 2. Jesus is able to save to the uttermost because He is the perfect permanent intercessor.
 - a. Jesus holds His priesthood permanently and continues as priest forever.
 - b. Jesus always lives to make intercession.
 - c. Jesus is holy.
 - d. Jesus is innocent.
 - e. Jesus is unstained. There was contact without contamination.
 - f. Jesus is separated from sinners, but not isolated from sinners.
 - g. Jesus is exalted above the heavens.
 - h. Jesus never needs to repent.
 - i. Jesus perfectly meets all of our needs.
 - j. Jesus proves Himself perfect forever.
