**Title: Praying Through The Battle of the Mind** 

**Scripture: Psalm 19** 

## Basic truths for all followers of Jesus regarding our minds:

- 1. We have the mind of Christ and we did <u>nothing</u> to earn it. (1 Cor. 2:11-16)
- 2. We have the capacity for creativity, innovation, and <u>imagination</u>. (Gen. 1:26-28)
- 3. Our minds are <u>deprayed</u> by the fall therefore we do not naturally think rightly about God or ourselves. (2 Corinthians 3:14, 1 Timothy 6:5, Ephesians 4:18, Romans 1:21, Romans 1:18, Colossians 2:8, 1 Corinthians 1:21)
  - a. Science affirms what God's WORD says about our broken minds.
    - i. There are almost 200 known cognitive biases and distortions that cause us to think and act irrationally. (1, 2, 3)
    - **ii.** Memories are shockingly unreliable and change over time. Emotions, motivation, cues, context and frequency of use can all affect how accurately you remember something.
    - iii. Of the thousands of thoughts a person has every day, it's estimated that 70% of this mental chatter is negative self-critical, pessimistic, and fearful. (4, 5)
  - b. Our minds are broken by sin, therefore we CANNOT trust what we think.
    - i. Our minds are: confused (<u>Deuteronomy 28:20</u>), anxious, closed (<u>Job 17:3–4</u>), evil & restless (<u>Ecclesiastes 2:21–23</u>), rash & deluded (<u>Leviticus 5:4</u>; <u>Isaiah 32:4 NIV</u>)
    - ii. Sin gives us: a troubled mind (2 Kings 6:11), a depraved mind (1 Timothy 6:5), a sinful mind (Romans 8:7 NIV), a dull mind (2 Corinthians 3:14 NIV), a blinded mind (2 Corinthians 4:4), a corrupt mind (2 Timothy 3:8)
  - c. We have an amazing ability to lie to ourselves.
  - d. We are preconditioned to misunderstand. We see what we want to see.

- 4. The gospel is the only remedy for our broken minds and the Word of God empowered by the Spirit is the weapon of victory in the battle of the mind.
  - a. We have to question what we think and weigh it with the Word of God!
  - b. Having the mind of Christ means that we have hope as we fight from victory not for victory. Lamentations 3:21-26
  - c. We pray the Word of God to navigate the battle of the mind.

## We pray from victory through the battle of the Mind:

- 1) When we spend time praying in creation, God reveals His wisdom, God's power, and God's glory to us. (Psalm 19:1-6)
- 2) When we spend time praying God's all-sufficient Word back to God, God reveals everything we need for life and godliness. (Psalm 19:7-11)
  - a) The perfect law converts the soul.
  - b) The sure testimony makes us wise.
  - c) The right precepts rejoice our thoughts and emotions.
  - d) The pure commandment enlightens our mind's eye.
  - e) The fear of the Lord enduringly cleans.
  - f) The true and righteous rulings warn and reward.
  - g) Keeping the Word enriches better than gold.
  - h) Keeping the Word satisfies sweeter than honey.
- 3) When we spend time praying for God to examine us, God reveals our sin, our victory over sin, and Spirit-empowered living and thinking. (Psalm 19:12-14)
